As comprehensive energy consultants, we provide energy audits to owners and renters in the state of Maryland and deliver quick home energy check-ups to multi-family properties and single-family homes. In addition, we help commercial properties across the nation prioritize which properties in their portfolio are best to retrofit based on available incentives and building needs. We're also an information source for people to better understand how we use, produce and think about our energy with a goal of inspiring positive action to make a change. It is our practice to support and educate others on the different types of energy and how to conserve resource consumption.

Environmentally Preferable Purchasing

greeNEWit uses recycled paper for any printed marketing material. We are in the process of distributing thousands of CFL light bulbs using recycled paper packaging.

Environmental Restoration or Community Environmental Projects

One of our greatest contributions to community oriented projects surrounding energy education is the OUR Schools Program. We started this project to spread the message of Ownership, Understanding and Responsibility with regards to our future global energy and resources situation. We give energizing presentations at schools to educate elementary, middle and high school students on the importance of connecting with the environment and how to be active citizens in the community to make the world a better place. Leaders from greeNEWit ignite an interest in science, math and the exploration of nature that anchors sustainability into the minds of the students and faculty. Since this push was initiated, we have reached more than 15,000 youth at schools in Howard, Baltimore, Montgomery and Prince George's County and raised money for extracurricular environmental clubs.

We host fundraisers where kids offer their friends, family and neighbors the opportunity to participate in Quick Home Energy Check-ups (QHEC), and Energy Audits. We then give money back to the school for each completed energy service job for investments in science, math, engineering, technology and overall energy improvements. greeNEWit plans to expand the OUR Schools Program nationally with a commitment to continued education.

The two co-directors of the OUR Schools Program recently became Green Leaders through MAEOE and are mentoring schools on how to complete the Green Schools certification process. greeNEWit's OUR Schools Program is now an approved activity that schools can participate in to get the Green Schools certification.

Being an active agent of change within the community is a core value of our company, and so we have implemented a strategy to recruit employees while nurturing environmental stewardship. The Agents of Change are a group of impressive college interns and brand advocates for greeNEWit that aim to inspire positive action and change the way we use, produce and think about our energy. Agents of Change can choose a sector of interest within greeNEWit such as community service, research and development, residential services, social media, etc.

Our goal is to create a collaborative working environment that fosters the generation and sharing of ideas. By creating a 'think tank', individuals who share a common passion to do good, expand their knowledge base and provoke socially aware responses in the community.

A unique quality of the program is that agents will be assigned tasks and asked to incorporate their own unique ideas and innovative strategies to generate a solution. They will have the opportunity to collaborate with other Agents of Changes and key leaders in greeNEWit to implement plans for putting those ideas into action.

This allows residential and multifamily homes to get energy upgrades at no additional charge to the monthly utility bills of tenants and owners. The upgrades include installation of energy efficient CFL light bulbs, aerators, low flow showerheads, hot water heat wraps and pipe insulation. Through this collaborative effort, we've distributed 410,260 compact fluorescent light bulbs to more than 44,728 residences in the state of Maryland and are saving 22,623,922 kWh of electricity and 522,294,176 gallons of water annually. Collectively, we're helping homeowners and businesses save \$6,477,453.74 annually in electricity, gas and water.

We recently purchased two company vehicles so each team of QHEC technicians travel to the property site in one utility van.
