Summary of AHERA Inspection Results (Sent to EPA) January 1, 2014 thru May 31, 2014

# Times Violated	Regulation
1	The LEA appears to be in compliance with AHERA, Federal, State regulations
4	Failed to conduct an AHERA inspection or reinspection pursuant to 40 CFR part 763
2	Failed to develop a management plan pursuant to 40 CFR part 763
1	Failed to use <u>accredited</u> persons
4	Failed to provide initial or annual notifications to parents/teachers/employee organizations
3	Failed to <u>notify</u> short term workers
4	Failed to conduct periodic surveillance
9	Failed to maintain required records
4	Failed to ensure proper compliance of response action
3	Failed to provide training for the designated person, custodial or maintenance staff
2	Failed to post warnings
4	Failed to qualify for an AHERA exclusion
10	Failed to sample new suspect material

CONTRACTORS' CORNER...

The Asbestos Licensing & Enforcement Section would like to welcome our new inspector, Nick Hartzell. He will be an asset to the Section. Please give him your fullest cooperation.

As some of you may have noticed, we have been issuing Administrative Settlement letters (ASL). This is an enforcement tool, which is used when a significant violation has occurred and has been corrected. Please note that penalties will increase if violations are repeated and show a recurring pattern. The following are some examples of ASLs that have been completed within the last 6 months:

- ASL mailed 5/6/2014 for \$5,500- Violations An employee was observed with the hood of his protective suit down, exposing his hair and upper body to an asbestos environment, a violation of COMAR 26.11.21.05D(1); There were no Project Notification signs posted at any entrance to or exit from the building in which an asbestos project was being conducted, a violation of COMAR 26.11.21.06A(2)(a); Failure to affix a label required by 29 CFR Part 1910 or 40 CFR Part 61 with the date the bags were sealed, a violation of COMAR 26.11.21.08A(2); and Failure to notify in accordance with the NESHAP.
- ASL mailed 5/6/2014 for \$1,500- Violation- Failure to construct a three-stage decontamination unit as required for a NESHAP renovation project.
