### Maryland's Plan for Global Warming

Over the past year, Maryland's Commission on Climate Change and its three working groups, or "twigs" as they became known, have been one of the broadest, hardest-working groups of experts across the State.

The Commission recently released its Climate Action Plan. This comprehensive study put together by more than one hundred of Maryland's finest professionals shows that there are clear environmental and economic benefits to taking early action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and that, in fact, it is readily feasible. The Plan provides a "road map" of forty-two options to achieve the needed reductions.

And there is more good news. For the first time, thanks to the leadership of Dr. Don Boesch of the University of Maryland's Center for Environmental Science, we now have a Maryland-specific scientific assessment of the impacts of climate change on our State. We are very fortunate to be unique throughout the Country in this regard.


As we all know, with over 3,000 miles of coastline, Maryland is the third most vulnerable state in the nation to the rising sea levels and erratic weather patterns associated with climate change. In 2007, Governor O'Malley issued an Executive Order charging the Commission to address three key questions: what can the State's

best scientists tell us about how and when climate change will affect Maryland's citizens and natural resources, what can Maryland do to adapt to the consequences of climate change, and what can Maryland do to reduce emissions of greenhouse gases to begin reversing global warming trends?

While the Commission recognized the magnitude of the challenge, the global nature of the issue, and the need to get moving forward, I am not sure we were all certain of the exact path forward. With this Plan, we now have a road map of where to go and what the benefits will be. We can turn the corner from "this is a big challenge" to "this is what we need to do next."

The technical analyses completed as a basis for the Plan also provided a refined assessment of where our existing programs are getting us. Between the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative, the Maryland Clean Cars Act, the Empower Maryland Initiative and the new Renewable Portfolio Standard. we will have more than half of the reductions needed to reduce emissions 25 percent by 2020.








