

Proclamation

From the Governor of the State of Maryland

LEAD POISONING PREVENTION WEEK OCTOBER 23 - 29, 2022

WHEREAS, Lead is a neurotoxin that enters the body through inhalation and ingestion of lead-containing substances, including leaded paint, dust, and soil; and

WHEREAS, In addition to lead-based paint hazards, children can be exposed to lead from additional sources, including cosmetics, spices, water in older pipes, travel outside of U.S., jewelry, toys, ceramics, and parental occupations; these exposures can cause irreversible and life-long health effects; and

WHEREAS, Even small amounts of lead in the blood can lead to impaired memory, decreased academic performance, hyperactivity, attention deficit disorder,

and other behavioral disorders; and

WHEREAS, In 1993, I in 4 Maryland children tested were diagnosed with an elevated blood lead level of 10 micrograms per deciliter of lead or greater; in

2020, this significantly lowered to 1 in 400 Maryland children tested; and

WHEREAS, New requirements to test all children in the state at 12 and 24 months of age, under the 2015 Targeting Plan, were associated with a 10.2%

increase in test rates of children age 12 months, and a 12.4% increase for children age 24 months; and

WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic has caused a significant decrease in blood lead testing in children across the state; and

WHEREAS, Maryland continues to encourage parents, caregivers, and healthcare providers to continue to test all children at ages 12 and 24 months, or at

anytime a possible lead exposure is expected for any child aged 0-72 months; and

WHEREAS, Effective October 28, 2022, Maryland is lowering the blood lead level that triggers lead case management from 5 to 3.5 micrograms per deciliter to

better protect Maryland children; and

WHEREAS, Education and awareness about the damages of lead can help protect the lives of children living in Maryland.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LAWRENCE J. HOGAN, JR., GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, do hereby proclaim OCTOBER 23 - 29, 2022 as LEAD POISONING PREVENTION WEEK in Maryland, and do commend this observance to our citizens.
