Environmentally Preferable Products and Services

We offer 10 outdoor locations of soccer programming throughout the state of Maryland. Our soccer classes are made up of small groups of no more than 10 students to reduce foot traffic at our facilities including families who run the risks of leaving behind excessive waste detrimental to the environment.

Environmental Restoration and Community Environmental Projects

Each season in the spring and fall, we have an environmental day where all of the families get together to help clean up their communities. We provide this option since our classes are offered at various private schools with a large amount of land. We help to clean-up ponds, forests, and other areas subject to waste.

Solid Waste Reduction and Reuse

We encourage the use of re-usable bottles by distributing them to all of our members as part of our registration package.



While we do encourage reusable bottles, we recycle any plastic bottles found at our 10 Maryland locations and make it a priority for our students to clean up after themselves.

Employee Commute/Customer Travel

Many of our students live in the same community and live about five miles from our facilities so we encourage families to carpool to training sessions to reduce the amount of single occupancy cars on the road and gallons wasted. We began implementing this in 2018, and we have seen a 40% decrease in the number of cars in the parking lots at our locations in the last two years.

Efficient Business Travel

We have a small staff of four who live between Howard, Prince George's, and Montgomery Counties and often times since we are out on the road at various locations, we do not get the opportunity to meet face to face for our monthly meetings. This is great for the environment because we are required to use Zoom for our weekly meetings.
