We enforce a stringent recycling program. CreateDC is proud to encourage recycling in every aspect of our company. We receive monthly reports from our recycler that include how much of each recycled product we have sent them. These are measurable and evaluated annually. To date in 2014, our recycled weight of paper is 36,000 lbs. We not only recycle paper as a standard practice but go several steps further and recycle all of our aluminum, plastics, glass and cardboard just to name a few. As an incentive for employees to recycle,

CreateDC puts any income generated through recycling into the company profit sharing plan.

Energy Efficiency

We encourage each of our employees to be as energy conscious as possible. An example of this is if we have two jobs for a particular piece of equipment both of those will be done consecutively and then that machine is turned off for the day. The same is true for lights in areas not in use. Those remain off until that area is producing product.

In 2013 we completely redid our overhead lighting using Pepco's Business Efficiency Program. Over 120 lights were changed to new 4-ft efficient lighting. The services were done through Matrix Energy services.
