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Environmental Policy Statement

Environmental Team

DAP Products Baltimore Plant is a participant in the Regional Manufacturing Institute Green Team Energy Conservation program for Baltimore County manufacturers. Our Green Team is comprised of a cross-section of hourly and management associates from various departments in the plant. We meet monthly to discuss and implement ideas solicited from all associates to reduce the environmental impact of our operation.

<u>Waste</u>

Recycling

We recycle pallets, drums, totes, cardboard, plastic wrap, plastic strapping and plastic containers. We currently recycle on average 121,000 pounds per month

Energy

Energy Efficiency

Through an energy audit conducted by RMI, we have identified opportunities to reduce our energy consumption by 10%, through capital investments we are planning to make.

<u>Water</u>

Stormwater Management and Site Design

Our plant adheres to a comprehensive Storm Water Protection Plan. Curbing has been installed to divert storm water and prevent soil erosion. 95% of storm water runoff on impervious surfaces is conveyed to a storm water management pond located on the north side of the property.

Inspections of the grounds are performed monthly to confirm all areas are free of debris and other substances that may adversely impact storm water color, odor or clarity.

DAP is subject to the Chesapeake Bay Restoration Requirements. Prior to the end of 2018 we will install a treatment basin on the southern corner of the facility to capture the required percentage of remaining runoff not captured in the storm water pond.
