COUNTY SOURCE REDUCTION (SR) CREDIT SUMMARY
For Calendar Year 2019

The number of shaded boxes illustrates the number of positive responses for each activity. A column does not correspond to any particular county. Each county had a unique combination of SR activities undertaken during the year. The credits awarded are summarized below:

- Counties (Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Baltimore City, Carroll, Cecil, Charles, Frederick, Harford, Howard, Montgomery, and Prince George’s) received the full 5% credit.
- Counties (Allegany,) received 4% credit.
- Counties (St. Mary’s) received 3% credit.
- Counties (Midshore Regional) received 2% credit.
- Counties (Washington) received 1% credit.
