Harbor site chosen as model

Maryland Governor Robert L. Ehrlich, Jr. praised a new national initiative recently that encourages incorporating land re-use into all federal cleanup projects.

Governor Ehrlich joined U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Administrator Christine Todd Whitman, federal and local officials April 10 at Harbor Point, the former AlliedSignal site along Baltimore's Inner Harbor, for announcement of the federal administration's new Land Redevelopment Agenda. The 27-acre site, being restored from decades of chromium and other contamination that leaked into the harbor, is an excellent example of how the new federal policy would apply to properties across the nation; and was cho-

sen by Cirque de Soleil as the grounds for the first stop on its latest North American tour.

"What will get built here will generate jobs, contribute to the tax rolls and add to this beauti-

MDE begins using STORET data system

STORET, short for **STOR**age and **RETR**eival, is a national environmental database developed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in the early 1960s to promote centralized storage and retrieval of environmental monitoring data collected by states and tribes.

The "legacy" version of STORET was run in the not-so-user-friendly mainframe computer environment, which often left users discouraged and frustrated. Starting in 1999, EPA redeveloped STORET on an Oracle platform to take advantage of the more modern architecture of personal computers and local servers. Environmental data from sediment and water, and biological data can now be entered into STORET from a local personal computer using software provided free by EPA. Users retain ownership over their copy of STORET and choose when (or whether) to share data with EPA. All data shared with EPA is made pub-

licly available via a web interface. EPA also provides free hands-on training, online and phone technical support.

The Maryland Department of the Environment's Technical and Regulatory Services Administration (TARSA) has been operating in a decentralized database environment where different monitoring programs maintain information using separate software systems. Additionally, data supplied by contracted vendors also is received in various software systems. This has limited TARSA's ability to share information both within and outside of the department. To address this, TARSA's Data Management Division was created to combine data from these separate systems into STORET.

"Having our ambient data in a consistent format in one location will facilitate the development of water quality assessments and Total Maximum Daily Loads to address the state's impaired waters," said

Anacostia gets much needed federal help

Supporting ongoing efforts to clean up one of the nation's most polluted rivers and revitalize it for public use, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) announced April 21 that the Anacostia River is selected as one of eight urban river restoration pilot projects. The pilots are part of the Urban Rivers Restoration Initiative, designed to promote urban river cleanup and

restoration nationwide through the collaborative efforts of these two federal agencies.

The pilot was announced by EPA Administrator Christie Todd Whitman. "This river is fortunate to have a great many people from the community interested in its health and future," said Administrator Whitman. "For years, the Anacostia River has been called Washington D.C.'s 'Forgotten River.'" But today, more and more people are responding to the obligation to be good stew-

Deadline draws near for smaller stormwater permittees

The Maryland Department of the Environment's Water Management Administration (WMA) recently adopted a general permit to cover those local governments affected by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Phase II stormwater program. Composed to meet requirements in the Clean Water Act (CWA) and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) regulations, this general permit will require an increased emphasis on controlling runoff and pollution discharged from storm drain systems from small urban municipalities throughout Maryland.

Adopted on April 11, MDE general permit (No. MDR 055500) addresses shortcomings left by EPA's NPDES Phase I stormwater program and, more importantly, requires each place that is affected by Phase II to implement six programs to improve urban water quality. MDE estimates that nearly 50 towns and cities from as far west as Washington County, through the Baltimore-Washington, D.C. suburbs, to Southern Maryland will be covered by this general permit.

EPA's original NPDES stormwater regulations, passed in November 1990, identified 11 categories of industrial activity and storm drain systems serving populations greater than 100,000 as major sources of pollution. On the municipal side of this program, individual NPDES stormwater permits subsequently required places like Baltimore City and County and Montgomery, Prince George's, Frederick, and Charles counties to invest heavily in activities and programs to address significant pollutant discharges from the most highly populated jurisdictions in Maryland. Having been in place for a decade, these Phase I permits created an increased focus on runoff management but left small municipalities located within these counties out of the regulatory arena. NPDES Phase II stormwater regulations were used to address this shortcoming

and include these areas into the scheme to improve stormwater pollution control programs.

Adopted in December 1999, NPDES Phase II stormwater regulations require permit coverage for towns with populations greater than 1,000 that are located within 2000 census designated urban areas. Each locality is required to implement six minimum control measures or programs. These include public outreach, public participation, illicit discharge detection and elimination, erosion and sediment control, post construction stormwater management, and good housekeeping. Each municipality can implement these measures independently or rely on the adjacent county performing identical functions under Phase I. Additionally, Phase II allows "qualifying local programs" to be used by small localities to comply with permit conditions. Examples of "qualifying local programs" include Maryland's on-going new development stormwater management and MDE's statewide erosion and sediment control programs. Each of these satisfies two of the six minimum control measures.

The general permit adopted recently provides the easiest way that local governments can apply for NPDES Phase II stormwater coverage. A simple permit application, or Notice of Intent (NOI) form, acknowledging the existence of the general permit and its conditions is submitted to MDE. In the NOI, localities describe the goals and expected practices used for the minimum program elements, the entity responsible for each, and the timeframe for program implementation. The application deadline is June 13, 2003.

ards of our natural treasures and rivers.”

Other pilot projects will be announced later this year. EPA will give each pilot project a \$50,000 grant.

The Anacostia River which flows through the District of Columbia and Maryland is contaminated with polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), pesticides, heavy metals, and raw sewage discharges from combined sewer overflows (CSOs). Pollution from CSOs pose threats to human health and wildlife, fish habitat, and also limits recreational fishing. The pilot project being announced will be the first step in helping to support the cleanup and restoration of the Anacostia.

This project was selected through a competitive process for its plans to restore wetlands; expand forest coverage; redevelop underused brownfields properties, and expand private and public stakeholder involvement.

Partnership hopes to cut school bus air pollution

EPA is launching a national

partnership to minimize pollution from school buses.

The Clean School Bus USA program will encourage policies and practices to eliminate unnecessary school bus idling, to install effective emission control systems on newer buses, and to replace the oldest buses with new ones.

Congress included \$5 million in EPA’s budget this year for a cost-shared grant program to assist school districts in upgrading their bus fleets. An additional \$20 million will be available through supplemental environmental projects.

Children’s health task force continues

The White House announced April 18 that it is extending President Bush’s Task Force on Environmental Health and Safety Risks to Children as part of his efforts to increase federal coordination on a wide range of children’s health issues.

The Task Force, co-chaired by EPA and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has identified asthma,

unintentional injuries, developmental disorders, including lead poisoning, and cancer for immediate attention.

An estimated 6.3 million children under 18 years of age suffered from asthma in 2001 and it was the fourth ranking cause of hospitalization among children less than 15 years of age. Asthma disproportionately affects children from lower-income families and children from different racial and ethnic groups. In addition,

nearly 430,000 American children between the ages of one to five had elevated blood lead levels that can cause irreversible disabilities such as lower IQ and neurological damage.

The National Children’s Study undertaken by this Task Force, will follow about 100,000 children before birth, through childhood, up to adulthood to look at the connections between environmental exposures and potential health effects.

He holds a political science degree from Towson University and is a graduate of the University of Baltimore School of Law.

He will be joining MDE toward the end of the month.

In the Office of the Secretary, Bernard Penner, formerly the agency’s enforcement and compliance coordinator, will assume an expanded role as Director of Special Programs. Under his oversight will be initiatives including enforcement and compliance coordination, environmental justice as well as research and development of innovative approaches to environmental problem-solving.

ful skyline," Governor Ehrlich said. "What will get built here will reduce sprawl by reducing demand on green space. Brownfields cleanup is critically important from both an environmental and economic development standpoint. It is an indispensable tool in the revitalization of urban communities."

Fourteen years ago, the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE), EPA along with Honeywell Corporation, the site's owner, began actions to investigate and cleanup the area so that future development opportunities could be pursued.

Now with that work complete, Harbor Point will become a centerpiece in the continuing revitalization of Baltimore's Inner Harbor. Under the direction of Struever Brothers, Eccles and Rouse, 1.8 million square feet of mixed-used space representing up to \$400 million in new investment will lead to creation of as many as 5,000 jobs. The redevelopment master plan also calls for a major public park and promenade.

"Administrator Whitman's Land Redevelopment Agenda will help ensure that the ultimate goal of brownfields cleanup - redevelopment - is achieved once environmental remediation has occurred," the Governor added.

The national agenda outlines 60 approaches that EPA can use in promoting land reuse throughout the country. Examples of these tools include: (1) EPA is training staff and managers to understand private sector needs in conducting real estate transactions and is forming Regional Land Revitalization Teams. (2) EPA is leveraging grant resources across multiple federal cleanup programs to facilitate area-wide cleanup and reuse of multiple contaminated properties. (3) EPA is reviewing

policies and practices concerning liability issues to promote, where appropriate, revitalization of properties.

"The Land Revitalization Agenda fosters EPA's ongoing efforts to return blighted properties to productive use to benefit communities, the economy and the environment," said Whitman. "Harbor Point truly epitomizes what the Agenda is all about. This redevelopment project has not only resulted in a safe and clean environment, but will help resurrect Baltimore's economy and provide the city with new jobs."

Baltimore Mayor Martin O'Malley was also on hand for the announcement. "Sites like Harbor Point have vast potential to expand jobs, and boost the surrounding neighborhoods," he said. "I am pleased that the EPA has devised and is now implementing the Land Revitalization Agenda to help remove one of the last hurdles to redevelopment - the fear of contamination and the liability associated with the cleanup."

After 140 years of chemical manufacturing, AlliedSignal, now Honeywell, acquired the property in 1954, and undertook a \$100 million chromium cleanup and closure project in conjunction with the government entities.

"Our Baltimore Inner Harbor project has succeeded because of the strong partnership we have had with EPA, the state of Maryland and the city of Baltimore," added Ted Fischer, Honeywell's Vice President, Health, Safety, Environment and Remediation. "All of us have supported a shared vision of cleanup and future development that will provide new economic and recreational opportunities for the citizens of Baltimore."

To facilitate redevelopment EPA has negotiated a Prospec-

tive Lessee Agreement (PLA), subject to public comment, to limit environmental liability. EPA's Mid-Atlantic Region's Smart Growth Memorandum of Agreement is credited with helping to bring about the PLA.

Rich Eskin, TARSA deputy director. "Additionally, capitalizing on STORET will allow the department to provide data to the public."

Data from MDE's STORET database will periodically be uploaded to EPA and made publicly available via EPA's STORET's website.

EPA also provides free software that will allow data managers to upload historical data to STORET and permits users to download selected data from STORET into PC spreadsheets for analysis. STORET will compel some basic discipline on ways in which TARSA data and information are structured. This sets uniform standards (which currently do not exist) for identifying all sampling stations throughout TARSA.

For example, all monitoring stations must include a unique identification for each station, the waterbody type, geographic coordinates, geopositioning datum/method, the state and the subdivision. It will not permit the en-

try of duplicate data, which is currently possible within existing databases. It will also require uniform nomenclature for descriptions of data results such as consistent chemical and nutrient descriptions and biological organism identifications, which currently may vary within the administration's decentralized databases. Furthermore, information from each data manager can be segregated into separate files which control data using a program-specific identification code provided by the EPA, as well as program-specific passwords. These segregated files, referred to in STORET as "Organizations," provide access security, which will limit data entry for specific projects by STORET Organizations.

STORET Organizations (programs) can define preferences or standard operating procedures associated with specific monitoring activities. These can include aids to data entry (e.g., substances tracked by monitoring

Derek A. Curtis, DDS – Prince George’s County--On March 11th, the Administrative Law Judge in the case against Dr. Curtis upheld MDE’s Final Decision. Dr. Curtis appealed MDE’s previously issued Complaint, Order, and Administrative Penalty for \$7,500 issued against him for failure to make corrections to resolve violations cited during an MDE inspection, including failure to provide proof of film badge monitoring in accordance with state radiation control regulations. **Status:** Dr. Curtis has 30 days to pay the Penalty. (Reference #RHP 01-30)

Maaco Auto Painting & Body Works – Wicomico County--On March 17th, MDE issued a Corrective Order and Proposed Civil Penalty in the amount of \$8,000 to this auto painting and body works facility located in Salisbury. MDE inspectors documented violations of air quality nuisance requirements on six different occasions. The MDE inspections were conducted in response to citizens’ complaints of strong odors and paint from the facility crossing property lines. The Corrective Order requires Maaco to submit a Plan for Compliance within 30 days to MDE that demonstrates how Maaco will achieve compliance. **Status:** Maaco has 10 days to

appeal the Order and request a meeting on the Penalty. (Reference #AQCP 02-49)

Baltimore Spice – Baltimore County--On March 20th, MDE received payment of \$25,000 from Baltimore Spice as required by a Consent Order between the Company and MDE. Baltimore Spice is a spice processing facility located in Owings Mills. The Company was cited for installing equipment without first having the required permits, failure to submit an emission certification report and air toxics analysis, failure to operate air pollution control equipment within specified parameters, and failure to comply with federal air toxics reporting requirements. The violations have since been resolved. **Status:** Case Closed. (Reference #AQCP 01-36)

The Sherwin-Williams Company – Baltimore City--On March 21st, MDE issued a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty in the amount of \$7,000 to Sherwin-Williams to address air quality violations. Sherwin-Williams operates a paint manufacturing facility in Baltimore City. During an inspection conducted by MDE, the inspector determined that the Company did not conduct monitoring of its equipment as required by its operating permit. Monitoring and record keeping are key requirements of the operating permit to help ensure compliance

with air quality requirements. The violations have since been corrected. **Status:** Sherwin Williams has 10 days to request a meeting on the Penalty. (Reference #AQCP 03-01)

McCormick & Company – Baltimore County--On April 3rd, MDE issued a Corrective Order and a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty in the amount of \$5,000 to McCormick & Company. McCormick operates a spice sterilization and processing facility subject to federal air toxics regulations governing ethylene oxide sterilization operations. McCormick failed to submit compliance status reports as required by the regulations. The Corrective Order requires submission of a Plan within 30 days of receipt of the Order to show how McCormick intends to satisfy future reporting requirements. **Status:** McCormick has 10 days to appeal the Order and request a meeting on the Penalty. (Reference #AQCP 03-02)

Earth Engineering and Sciences, Inc. - Baltimore County--On April 8th, MDE issued a Complaint, Order and Administrative Penalty in the amount of \$2,300 against Earth Engineering and Sciences, Inc. for failure to adequately secure and safely operate a portable nuclear density gauge and for use of the device in violation of its license. **Status:** Earth Engineering has 10 days to appeal the Order and

30 days to request a hearing on the Penalty. (Reference #RHP 02-04)

Charles and Marian Nieman - 1 affected property - Frederick County - Charles and Marian Nieman were issued a Complaint, Order and \$21,000 Civil Penalty on March 17 for violating Maryland’s Lead Laws by failing to register pre-1950 rental units and failing to obtain risk reduction certificate(s) of lead inspection compliance. **Status:** Charles and Marian Nieman have 10 days to request a hearing on the Complaint and Order and 30 days to request a hearing on the Penalty. activities or habitat evaluation criteria), field equipment descriptions, analytical labs and methods, bibliographic references, etc. This capability does not exist across the current databases. This allows critical monitoring protocols not generally contained in raw datasets to be linked to monitoring projects and results, thus providing the proper data context to ensure data consistency and repeatability. This regi-

mented approach helps to guarantee the quality of the data used for regulatory decision-making.

EPA may impose requirements in the future for states to use STORET as part of their water quality monitoring and assessment programs. "MDE feels that implementing the STORET package now will improve its business processes and provide a vehicle through which data collected at

public expense can be made widely available," Eskin added. Although a final Enterprise Environmental Management System selection has not been made yet for MDE, it will have the provision to link to the STORET data.

Data sharing is not only necessary for meeting MDE responsibilities, but valuable for all monitoring groups. Working with the Maryland Water Monitoring Council Data Manage-

ment Committee, MDE is striving to encourage submission of data in a format that can be loaded into its system. If local governments and volunteer organizations do not already have a data storage system, MDE is encouraging consideration of the STORET system for the exchange of water quality data.

D&G Brice Contractors, Inc., Baltimore City - On April 3, 2003, MDE and D&G Brice Contractors, Inc. (D&G Brice) finalized an administrative Consent Order regarding improvements to ensure compliance with NPDES permit requirements for the D&G Brice ready-mix concrete facility located at 2901 Waterview Avenue in Baltimore. Under the terms of the Consent Order, D&G Brice has agreed to cease unauthorized discharges of wastewater and/or concrete waste to waters of the State by implementation of interim wastewater storage and disposal methods until such time as an approved wastewater treatment and storage facility has been installed. D&G Brice is required to submit to MDE for review and approval a plan for these improvements and an application for a State/NPDES discharge permit within established milestone dates of the Consent Order. Upon MDE's confirmation that an approved wastewater treatment system has been in-

stalled and is fully functional, the Consent Order will authorize D&G Brice to discharge treated wastewater from washing concrete mixer trucks and equipment, as well as excess feed water and treated stormwater to surface waters and groundwaters of the State in accordance with established effluent limitations, monitoring and reporting requirements. The authorization to discharge under the terms of the Consent Order will remain in effect until MDE's final determination on the issuance of a State discharge permit for the facility. D&G Brice has agreed to pay to the Clean Water Fund an administrative penalty of \$19,000 in this case; however, MDE has agreed to waive the penalty provided D&G Brice complies with all requirements of the Consent Order. In addition, D&G Brice has agreed to pay stipulated penalties for any future violations of the Consent Order milestone dates or for violations of established interim effluent limitations. **Status:** Case closed. (Reference # CO-03-0216).

Rawlings Improvement Association - Allegany County - On April 15, 2003, MDE and the Rawlings Improvement Association (the "Owner") finalized an administrative Consent Order regarding corrective actions to the Rawlings Wastewater Treatment

Plant located on Conda Way Extended in Rawlings, Maryland. Under the terms of the Consent Order, the Owner has agreed to complete specific upgrades to the wastewater treatment plant and implement operational and maintenance improvements by established milestone dates to ensure compliance with discharge permit effluent limitations. The Owner has also agreed to submit an engineered evaluation of the wastewater treatment plant following implementation of improvements. The Owner has agreed to pay an administrative penalty of \$2,000 to the Clean Water Fund in settlement of past discharge permit violations and has also agreed to pay stipulated penalties for future discharge permit effluent violations or failure to meet scheduled milestone dates of the Consent Order. **Status:** Case Closed. (Reference #CO-03-0109).

Water and Sediment Pollution Penalties - Statewide

During the period March 14, - April 15, 2003, MDE collected an additional \$1,550 to the Clean Water Fund in resolution of alleged water pollution violations from four facilities and \$21,930 to the Sediment Fund in resolution of alleged erosion and sediment control/sediment pollution violations from eight facilities.
