

# Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) for Real Estate Professionals

### 1. How can you determine if there is asbestos in the home?

- A homeowner can take a sample themselves, or they may hire a consultant to conduct a survey and collect samples of materials for laboratory analysis.

#### 2. Is it necessary to remove asbestos?

• Abetos-containing material (ACM) should be removed if it is more than slightly damaged, or if you plan to make changes to your home that could potentially disturb the material.

## 3. Who is permitted to remove ACM from a single family residence?

- Non-friable ACM (material that is not easily crumbled): Can be removed by a licensed asbestos contractor, an unlicensed contractor, or the homeowner.
- Friable ACM (material that can be crumbled, pulverized, or reduced to powder by hand pressure): Must be removed by a licensed asbestos contractor.
