This report was commissioned by the Mid-Atlantic Regional Council on the Ocean (MARCO) and includes an analysis of 63 counties and independent cities from Montaulk Point, NY to Virginia Beach, VA and encompasses the Chesapeake Bay. The study characterized and analyzed the vulnerabilities to the maritime transportation industry, fisheries and fishing communities, and ecosystem services as a result of climate change.
