Maryland HBCUs (Coppin, Bowie, UMD Eastern Shore, Morgan)	For a century after the end of slavery in the United States in 1865, most colleges and universities in the Southern States prohibited all African Americans from attending, while institutions in other parts of the country regularly employed quotas to limit admissions of blacks. HBCUs were founded primarily to address exclusion of African Americans in higher education. However, today, HBCUs serve students of all racial and ethnic identities.
