Meeting Convened

The March 2024 Radiation Control Advisory Board (RCAB) meeting was held in person at the Maryland Department of the Environment and virtually on Google Meet and was called to order at 2:18 p.m. by RCAB Chair, Sean Austin.

Introduction

The RCAB Chair completed roll call.

Approval of Last Minutes

The first order of business was a call for approval of the last meetings minutes. David O'Neill made a motion to accept the minutes as written and Josephine M. Piccone seconded the motion. The Board voted all in favor of approving the minutes as drafted.

The Chair introduced Cari Borràs, Medical Physicist, Consultant: Radiological and Health Service.

The Chair introduced Orhan Suleiman, Ph.D. as the newly appointed board member.

Old Business:

License Renewal Update from Ad-hoc subcommittee

Greg Smith shared information from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) Agencywide Documents Access and Management System, which indicated license expiration are 10 years and broad-scope licenses are 15 years. He also noted that some companies requested license extensions, which were granted, and suggested that MDE could use this method as a guideline to assist in reducing the workload of licenses reviewers.

The Chair inquired about reducing the time for renewing a license and suggested, if there were no significant changes to a licensee's operations, extension of a licensee's expiration date would be something that can be investigated and that this would be the best course of action considering the current staffing issues and time it currently takes to renew a license. Shannon Page informed the board that this was one of the topics for discussion in an upcoming MDE/NRC meeting. In the meantime, MDE is still receiving assistance from other Agreement State agencies, e.g. Georgia, with licensing actions.

Presentation

Cari Borràs- The Role of the Health Physicist in Radiotheranostics

Orhan Suleiman commented on his experiences with the FDA as it relates to Ms. Borras presentation. He mentioned that radiotherapeutics was initially used for pain, but further research showed that patients experienced less pain, less side effects, and had an overall increased in survival rate.

Proposed Changes to COMAR 26.01.01 for Supplement 35

The Chair drafted a letter regarding a regulation change to part J, SEC.J.13 "Notification and Reports to Individuals". The changes were approved by MDE and has been incorporated into Supplement 35.

MDE/RHP Staffing

The RHP is currently fully staffed. Onboarding began this month for the 3 positions in the Radioactive Materials Division. The RHP staff is continuing to receive external support to become fully qualified license reviewers.

There was no new business for the board.

The Chair encouraged board members to present or invite presenters.
