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Roadmap – Federal Provisions Corresponding to Provisions in the Code of Maryland Regulations That Were Proposed May 16, 2025

On May 16, 2025, the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) proposed to adopt revisions to Title 26 Subtitle 13 of the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR 26.13). Major elements of the proposal include management standards for recalled automotive airbags, alternate management standards for hazardous waste aerosol cans, conditional exclusions for solvent-contaminated wipes, changes to the ignitability characteristic definition, and management standards for hazardous waste pharmaceuticals generated by healthcare facilities. The following table identifies the principal COMAR provisions in the proposal that correspond to these programmatic elements. Note: the proposal also includes a number of technical corrections to existing requirements that are not identified in the table. Among the technical corrections is a change that revises administrative procedures for permitting to match statutory requirements that were already being followed. These changes are found in the proposed regulations at COMAR 26.13.07.20 – 26.13.07.20–6.
