

## Proclamation

From the Governor of the State of Maryland LEAD POISONING PREVENTION WEEK

OCTOBER 19-25, 2025

WHEREAS, Lead poisoning remains a serious environmental health concern, particularly for young children; and

WHEREAS, Even low levels of lead in children's blood can cause irreversible damage to the brain and nervous system, leading to

learning disabilities, behavioral problems, and other adverse health effects; and

WHEREAS, Lead-based paint and lead-contaminated dust are the most common sources of lead exposure in homes built before 1978;

and

WHEREAS, Effective prevention strategies, including lead hazard reduction, blood lead screening, and public education, are crucial to

protecting children from lead poisoning; and

WHEREAS, Lead Poisoning Prevention Week provides an important opportunity to raise awareness about the dangers of lead,

promote preventative actions, and encourage collaboration among communities, health professionals, and government agencies; and

WHEREAS, All citizens are urged to learn about the dangers of lead, take steps to prevent lead exposure in their homes, and support

efforts to eliminate lead poisoning from our communities; and

WHEREAS, Maryland is committed to reducing lead exposure from housing through providing lead abatement funding statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WES MOORE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, do hereby proclaim OCTOBER 19-25, 2025 as LEAD POISONING PREVENTION WEEK in Maryland, and do commend this observance to all of our citizens.
