Fiscal Year 2025 reports are due no later than July 31, 2025. Failure to submit this report in a timely manner may result in an administrative enforcement action.

I certify, under penalty of law, that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted in this application form, and that the information provided is true, accurate, and complete. I understand that the inclusion of any false or misleading information, or the exclusion of required information in this application, may cause the Administration to issue an Administrative Complaint seeking civil penalties in accordance with Environment Article § 4-412 and § 4-417¹, Annotated Code of Maryland, and may include the suspension or revocation of any permit or license issued. I further understand that failure to notify the Administration of oil spills, leaks, or discharges regardless of size, is a violation of Sections 4-401 through 4-420 of the Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, which may also subject me to an Administrative Complaint and civil penalties.
