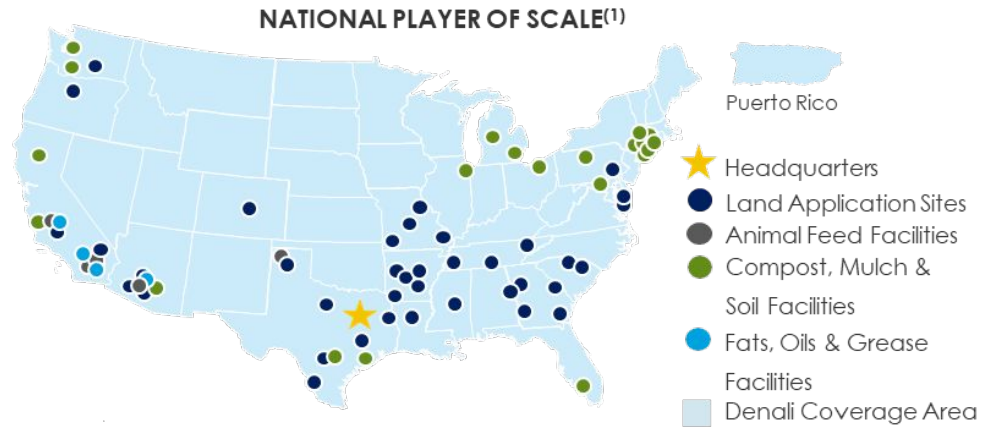

Types of Food Waste

Pre Consumer – *a.k.a. known as Back of the House*

- Unpackaged Food vs Packaged Food
- Meats – Fats, Oils, Grease
- Fruits, Vegetables, & Bakery
- More controls = Less Chance for Contamination

Post Consumer- *a.k.a. Front of the House*

- Unpackaged Food vs Packaged Food
- Containers and Utensils- Compostables
- Lack of controls = Increased Chance of Contamination



Types of Food Waste Outlets

Pre Consumer

- **Packaged waste**
 - Digestors or Compost Facilities
 - Not many compost facilities have the equipment to depack
- **Meats and Grease**
 - probably cant go to Feed animals
 - Compost facilities may not want this material either- vector attraction
- **Fruits, Vegetables, & Bakery**
 - Feed, Compost, and Digestors
 - If going to feed- need 100% free of contamination

Post Consumer-

- **Unpackaged Food vs Packaged Food**
 - Digestors and/or Compost
 - If compost facility has depack equipment
- **Containers and Utensils**
 - Digestors and/or Compost
 - If compost facility can handle compostable material used for containers/utensils



Training Required

- **In person and virtual**
- **Need Buy in from Key Stake Holders**
 - Customer
 - Driver
 - As waste stream changes... training changes
 - Pre vs Post Consumer - Package vs Depackage
 - Definition of contamination changes
 - Outlets
- **Ongoing**
 - Different Seasons
 - High Employee Turnover in Retail



Commercial Foodwaste Regulations

- **Permits:**
 - Agricultural vs Solid Waste
 - How you are classified may vary
 - Township - City – State
 - Each could have their own requirements
 - Enclosures, reporting, permits, equipment, etc
- **Contamination:**
 - GW and FW bans make it challenging when dealing with Contamination to Land Fills
- **Legislation:**
 - Foodwaste Mandates- Radius around outlets
 - Sparks infrastructure- but can take time
 - Language can be vague (on purpose)
 - What is a fair price?
