2024 - 2025 Marine Contractors License Renewal Instructions

NEW: LICENSE CATEGORY SELECTION REQUIRED WITH THIS RENEWAL OF YOUR MARINE CONTRACTORS LICENSE

On March 18, 2024, MDE issued regulations for the Marine Contractors Licensing Board. These are in the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 26.30. Among other things, these regulations established four (4) license categories (see Attachment 1). New applicants for a Marine Contractors License are now required to apply for a specific Category of Marine Contractors License. Currently, licensed Marine Contractors are required to apply for a license Category when they renew their current license.

Since your license is now up for renewal, you are now required to go through the License Category selection and Board approval process.

In the included Renewal Application, you or your company is required to select a single License Category and submit documentation to support your selection. Your License Category selection should be based on the work experience and history of you or your company's Representative. You will not be required to go through this License Category selection and approval process in future renewals unless you change your Representative or you want to apply for a different License Category.

Your License Category selection is subject to the Board's review and approval.

License Category Selection Information

The four license categories are:

Category 1: Heavy Marine Construction (also authorizes Cats. 2, 3, & 4 services)

Category 2: Residential and Commercial Marine Construction (also authorizes Cats. 3 & 4 services)

Category 3: Limited Marine Construction (authorizes a specific subset of Category 2 activities. For example, Boat Lifts).

Category 4: Incidental Marine Contractor Services (authorizes specific marine contractor activities. For example, directional drilling).

ATTACHMENT 1 LISTS THE FOUR LICENSE CATEGORIES AS FOUND IN THE REGULATIONS.

In your renewal application, you will select a License Category that best fits the marine contractor services performed, and that can be supported with documentation. It is therefore the work experience of your Company's Representative that should guide your License Category selection. Required documentation includes providing locations/sites where marine contractor services were performed that support your License Category selection.

Documents Required: Submit a minimum of 5 work locations supporting your Category selection.

Optional Documents: You may submit additional information/documentation to support the License Category selected. Please see Attachment 2 for a list of documents you may want to consider submitting.

<u>Category 3 and Category 4: Additional Requirement:</u> In these two categories, you will need to identify which marine contractor activity(s)/specialty(s) you are applying for licensure.

A Category 3 and Category 4 License will only authorize the specific marine contractor service(s) specifically stated/identified in YOUR License

Further Information Regarding License Renewal Requirements:

A Marine Contractors License is valid for two years. The License will identify the issuance and expiration dates. The License should be signed by the licensee or representative shown on the License. The bottom portion of the License should be conspicuously displayed in the office of the individual or entity shown on the License. The top portion of the License may be carried by the individual licensee or entity representative.

- Keeping Licensee Information Current: The Board must be notified of any changes in the licensee's contact information or the named entity representative on the License. If an entity's representative is no longer a part of the company, then a new representative must be appointed by the entity. The Marine Contractors Licensing Board (MCLB) should be notified in writing of the new entity representative within 5 days. The new representative shall submit an application to the MCLB and pass the license test within 45 days of the change in representative.
- **Renewal Notice:** Licensees are responsible for keeping the License current. Licensees will be sent a renewal notice 60 days prior to the expiration date of the License. If a License has expired for greater than 45 days, then the former Licensee will need to submit a new License application to the Board.

Vehicle Marking: The License number needs to be marked on at least one truck or piece of heavy equipment in at least three-inch block lettering. The marked vehicle should be on any work site during the work day. Magnetic License numbers may be used to transfer from one piece of equipment to another.

• Insurance Requirements: The licensee must carry commercial general liability insurance with a \$300,000 total aggregate minimum and carry workers' compensation insurance unless exempt by law. A current Certificate of Insurance must be submitted with the renewal application showing Marine Contractors Licensing Board as the Certificate Holder

Continuing Education Requirements to Maintain Your License

12 Hours Required

To renew a Marine Contractors License a licensee needs to submit to the MCLB, at the time of License renewal, satisfactory proof of completion of 12 hours of approved continuing education. Approved continuing education needs to be completed by the individual licensee or entity representative named on the License. Continuing education must be performed during the current License period.

Approved continuing education may consist of participation in any of the following types of training provided the representative receives satisfactory proof of completion, such as a certificate, attendance record, or other approved document. Acceptable continuing education can be any training that is related to business, construction, or engineering, such as (1) College level courses, (2) Courses, seminars, workshops, or lectures, (3) Extension studies and/or correspondence courses, (4) Continuing education courses, and (5) Any other training approved by the MCLB. The representative may attend several training events over the course of the 2-year license period which will equal the equivalent of 12 hours of training.

Listed below are examples of the types of <u>Continuing Education</u> acceptable to the MCLB. The list is not comprehensive. If you are in doubt whether a training course is acceptable, contact the MCLB for review and approval. Documentation of attendance and number of hours awarded are needed from the training authority.

- Business accounting, administration, or any business management training.
- First aid or CPR Certification training.
- Materials vendor training (training in the use and installation of pressuretreated lumber, boat lift mechanisms, plant materials, etc.).
- Marine contractor online training modules on the Marine Contractor Licensing Board webpage. There are two training modules found at the link below.

NOTE: On March 18, 2024, MDE promulgated regulations for the Marine Contractors Licensing Board. These are in the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 26.30. Among other things, these regulations establish license categories.

There are now **Four** Categories of Marine Contractor Services (see Attachment 1).

For this renewal application, your company is required to select a single license Category, and submit documentation to support your selection.

Your license Category selection is subject to the Board's review and approval. Your selection should be based on the work experience and history of your company.

ATTACHMENT 1

The four (4) Marine Contractor License Categories.

The following is in the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 26.30.

Category 1: Heavy Marine Construction. This license category is suitable for contractors who perform, or solicit to perform, the following marine contractor services:

- (a) Bridges and highways, large-scale commercial development, commercial dredging, cargo and naval wharves, beach renourishment, heavy salvage, and any other large-scale marine services, as approved by the Board.
- (b) Marine contractors licensed under Category 1 may also perform any of the marine contractor services authorized under Categories 2, 3, and 4 of this section.

Category 2: Residential and Commercial Marine Construction. This license category is suitable for contractors who perform, or solicit to perform, the following marine contractor services:

(a) Piers, docks, wharves, marinas, boathouses, pile driving, moorings, boat lifts, floating docks, riprap revetments, bulkheads, weirs, seawalls, boat ramps, living shorelines, beach nourishment, dunes, dredging, salvage, and any other medium to small scale marine contractor services, as approved by the Board.

(b) Marine contractors licensed under Category 2 may also perform any of the marine contractor services authorized under Categories 3 and 4 of this section.

Category 3: Limited Marine Construction. This license category is suitable for contractors who only perform, or solicit to perform, a limited subset of the marine contractor services listed in Category 2.

A Category 3 License only authorizes the specific marine contractor services identified in the License, as issued by the Board.

Category 4: Incidental Marine Contractor Services. This license category is suitable for contractors who perform or solicit to perform, the following marine contractor services: directional boring, aquaculture, submerged aquatic vegetation and wetland grass planting, and any other related marine contractor services, as approved by the Board.

ATTACHMENT 2

Supplemental Information to Support Category Selection.

The following is a list of documents you may submit to support your license Category selection. Please Note: submission of any of these documents is *optional*. However, we do recommend reviewing this list and consider submitting these additional documents if you think they will support your Category selection.

Documentation that may support your Category selection include:

Copies of executed contracts.

Copies of Tidal Wetlands authorizations.

The size of your crew.

The number of crews you can field at the same time.

The Equipment your company owns and the type of projects that can be done, for example, driving piles

Length of piles your company is equipped to drive

Depth of water experienced to provide marine construction services

Examples of Type of work your company has provided: For example,

- Shoreline stabilization projects
 Types of materials used
- Pier construction projects Types of materials used

Boatlifts: Modular and/or pile driving done.

Further information on your Workman's Compensation policy - A copy of your last audit

Documentation of Longshoreman's Insurance.

Photos of jobs performed; company owned equipment

Other documentation that you feel supports your Category selection.
