202161424/21-WQC-0326: Maryland Department of Natural Resources, 580 Taylor Avenue, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 has requested a State Water Quality Certification in connection with its application to the Army Corps of Engineers for a federal Clean Water Act (CWA) permit to restore the stream channel and wetlands at Jabez Branch Tributary 3 (Class III) in Millersville, Maryland. The purpose of this project is to restore impaired hydrological, hydraulic, geomorphic, and physiochemical functions of the stream and wetland ecosystems. The project will temporarily impact 2,199 linear feet (18,768 square feet) of perennial stream, and 185,852 square feet of the 100-year floodplain. The project will also temporarily impact 79,165 square feet of nontidal wetlands, and 70,419 square feet of 25-foot nontidal wetland buffer. The wetland impacts are expected to be self-mitigating on-site through the creation of new wetland areas.
