Dear Danielle A. Spendiff,

RE: Maryland Department of the Environment Baltimore-Washington Rapid Rail (BWRR) Clean Water Act, Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) for building of the Baltimore-Washington Superconducting Magnetic Levitation (SCMaglev) train.

As the mayor of a town who would be directly impacted by the construction of the MAGLEV project, I am writing to express my strong opposition to the recent application for a water quality permit submitted for the MAGLEV project. While I understand the potential benefits of modernizing our transportation infrastructure, I believe that the drawbacks and concerns associated with this project far outweigh any advantages.

My opposition to this maglev project is based on several key concerns:

- 1. **Cost and Funding**: The immense cost of developing and implementing a maglev system, as well as the uncertainty surrounding funding sources, raises concerns about the financial burden this project will place on taxpayers.
- 2. **Environmental Impact**: The construction of dedicated maglev tracks and the potential disruption of local ecosystems and communities raise environmental concerns that must be carefully considered and addressed.
- 3. **Energy Consumption**: The energy requirements of maglev systems are substantial, and we should be focusing on sustainable and energy-efficient transportation solutions in an era of climate change and environmental conservation.
- 4. **Community Disruption**: The disruption caused by the construction of maglev tracks and the potential impact on property values and the quality of life for local residents cannot be ignored.
- 5. Lack of Compatibility: The inability of maglev trains to integrate with existing rail infrastructure limits their utility and compatibility with our existing transportation networks.
